offering holistic developmental support to our beneficiaries and their communities. In 2004 we started working in 5 facilities, in 2019 that number reached 52.

We have spent the last 15 years growing, succeeding, failing, learning, adapting, improving, taking on more responsibility, forming new partnerships, setting goals and growing some more.

We have worked out what is really important - the investment that we make in our children today will result in a generation of capable, confident, educated, compassionate and ambitious young adults.

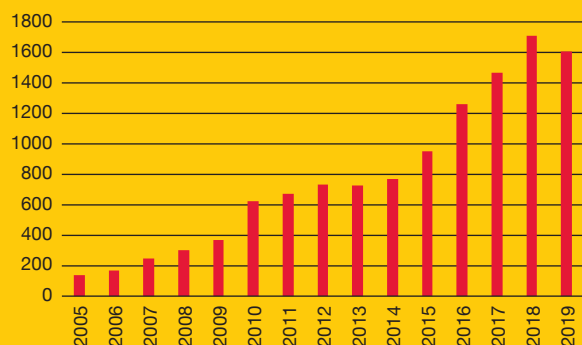

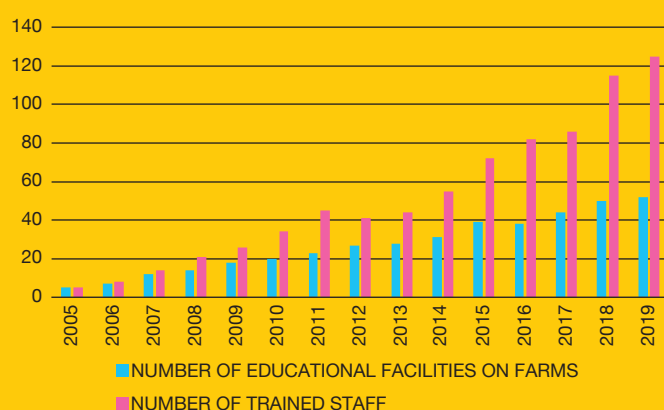


Our Numbers 2018 - 2019

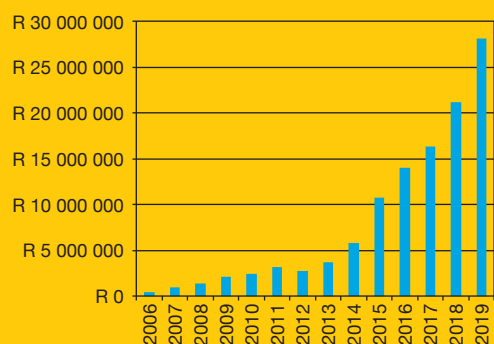
Beneficiary Numbers
2005 - 2019



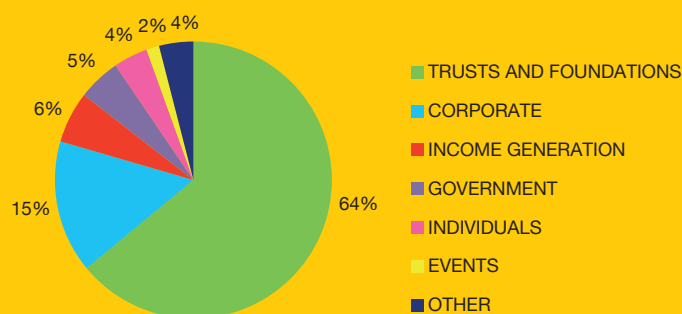
Number of Facilities and Staff trained
2005 - 2019



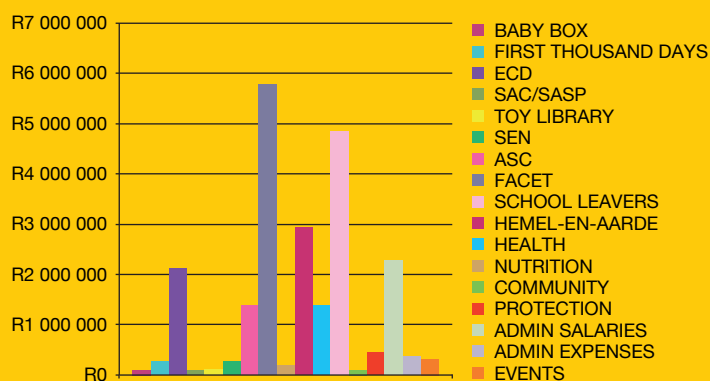
SA and UK income
2006 - 2019



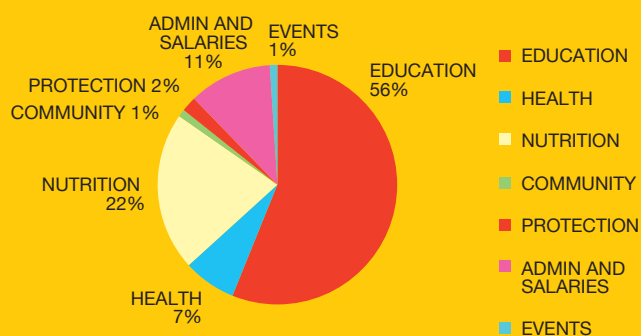
Income Sources 2018 - 2019

Where we work

We work in the Western Cape of South Africa, supporting children and their families in farming communities in Stellenbosch, Somerset West, Paarl, Citrusdal, Wellington, and Hemel-en-Aarde (Hermanus).

VISION: A world of opportunities for empowered communities.

MISSION: The work and mission of The Pebbles Project consists of 5 main pillars:

Education, Health, Nutrition, Community and Protection.

VALUES: Compassion, Commitment, Courage and Integrity.





Our Programmes

What did we get up to in 2018-2019?

Baby Box Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The initiative aims to reduce harm to developing fetuses and babies by preventing the use of alcohol during pregnancy and infancy, and to ensure that healthy mothers give birth to healthy babies. Mothers-to-be are educated on pregnancy, potential neonatal dangers, the birthing process as well as infant development during the first 1000 days. When mothers refrain from drinking alcohol during pregnancy and attend a series of antenatal workshops at our Owethu Clinic, they receive a baby box containing all the items they need for the first few weeks of the baby's life.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 10 pregnant women completed the series of workshops delivered by our enthusiastic Programme Coordinator Nina and 8 mothers-to-be received the baby box full of goodies. Two women did not receive the baby box due to alcohol use, but they were referred for additional support from our social workers.
- 7 of the pregnancies were planned and 3 were unplanned, so we have work to do with informing women about contraception and the different family planning options that are available to them.
- 7 of the 10 women were smokers, but stopped during their pregnancy as a result of interventions through the workshops.
- Funding has been a challenge for this essential programme and we continue to seek donors to enable us to reach many more pregnant women in the areas in which we operate.



First Thousand Days (FTD) Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The FTD programme is designed to stimulate children between the ages of 3 months to 2 years through monthly training sessions with FTD practitioners and a programme developed by Occupational Therapists and teachers.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- Congratulations to Lettie, one of our FTD Support Teachers, who qualified as a licensed Infant Massage Instructor. Five mothers and their infants attended our first baby massage group.
- A monitoring tool for measuring the development of children in our FTD classes was implemented in partnership with the Occupational Therapy Department of Stellenbosch University.

- An Occupational Therapy assessment clinic was established by our very capable FTD Programme Manager Liezl, with assistance from 18 OT students from Stellenbosch University.
- Dance and Movement Therapy students from the Netherlands presented a successful programme for mothers and babies on attachment and bonding.
- A special thank you goes to the Narollah Trust for the ongoing funding of this programme, as well as the Baby Box and Protection programmes.



Early Childhood Development (ECD) Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The ECD programme provides holistic support to children between the ages of 3 and 5 years and for ECD practitioners through monthly training sessions and onsite support services. A mobile toy library visits the ECD centres to deliver toys for the children to borrow.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 229 Grade R learners received a school pack in January 2019, consisting of a school bag, uniform and shoes and a complete stationery kit.
- All learners aged 4 – 5 years achieved significant progress when results of their June and December 2018 assessments were analysed. We are confident that these children entered Grade R in January 2019 well-prepared for school and we congratulate our hard-working ECD team for their passion and dedication to their programme: Lyn-Maree, Marzanne, Mariza, Suzette, Catherine and Talita.
- 233 of our learners will enter Grade R in 2020 and will be completing their school career in Grade 12 in 2033.
- In early 2019, we implemented the Pre-Literacy Programme for the 3 - 5 year olds. This exciting programme consists of stories (written by one of our ECD Support Teachers) that introduce the children to different letter sounds in a fun and interactive way.
- The mobile toy library, managed by Lettie and Loryn, and the mobile book library visited 19 farms every fortnight and reached 500 children, offering them each an opportunity to borrow a toy to play with at home.
- FACET Mobile Book Library Programme Manager Sylvia's innovative puppet show continued to enrich our monthly ECD themes and was used to teach valuable new life skills to our younger learners.
- Thank you to the Oppenheimer Memorial Trust for their support of this programme.



After School Club (ASC) Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The ASC programme provides educational support to school-going children from Grade R to Grade 12. This programme focuses on the holistic development of the child through homework supervision, curriculum support as well as extra-mural activities and is confidently managed by Christeline. The FACET Foundation in the UK is a core donor for this programme and over the last 5 years have donated in the region of \$2million.



ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 49 Grade 8 learners and 19 Matric learners received a school pack in January 2019.

FACET MOBILE LIBRARY

- The mobile book library catered for over 500 ECD and ASC children aged 3 months to 18 years who visited the library on a fortnightly basis.
- The programme supported the children's literacy development and provided valuable resources for school research projects as well as study guides.

FACET MOBILE COMPUTER LABS

- Our two mobile learning labs visited 10 ASC facilities on a weekly basis, reaching 300 learners aged 5 – 18 years.
- There has been a noticeable improvement of computer literacy amongst learners, who are now able to apply the knowledge and skills they have acquired through the training sessions presented by Ismail, Winston and Charles, our IT whizz kids.
- The mobile computer labs have provided IT training for other local NPOs; it is rewarding to see this programme reach new learners and support partner charities.

FACET LIFE SKILLS

- 10 Stellenbosch ASCs participated in the Life Skills programme, with a focus on entrepreneurial skills. Our support teachers Ingrid and Nathaniel also partnered with a local primary school to deliver life skills lessons, enabling us to maximize the number of children accessing this vital programme.
- 20 learners in our ASCs were elected by their peers to be ambassadors for their club, based on their potential leadership qualities. These ambassadors attended regular meetings and leadership workshops, as well as a camp which focused on confidence building, problem solving, team-work and improving self-esteem.

FACET LITERACY TUTORING

- Our dedicated reading tutors Mari and Hanli visited 8 of our Stellenbosch ASCs on a regular basis to present reading programmes, specifically for Grade 1 - 4 learners, but also to assist older learners with their homework.
- Each learner was assessed in April and October and evidence from these assessments indicated that the number of learners now scoring above their chronological age had increased.

FACET MATHS TUTORING

- Our genius maths tutors Philanie and Charné supported 292 children from Grade R to Grade 12 in our after-school clubs and our learners achieved a 96% pass rate in the 2018 end of year examination.
- One learner, Evan Douries from Bellevue farm community won the Excellent Achievement Award for Mathematics in December 2018, scoring an outstanding 94.6% in his Cami Maths programme.

EDUCATION SUPPORT

- Our Education Support team in Citrusdal – Narine, Betsie and Chris, ensured that the 600 children in the farm facilities in Citrusdal received the support they needed in order to flourish in school. These services were delivered in our FACET multi-purpose vehicles, which are fully equipped for children of all ages.
- The newly implemented Grade R programme focused on developing maths, language, social and life skills through play and proved highly effective.

SPORT

- Children from a number of our farms participated in a range of sporting activities during the year, including horse-riding, rope-skipping, ballet, netball and surfing, thanks to the hard work of Marian, our ASC Sport Programme Coordinator.
- Our rope-skipper put on a spectacular performance at the After-School Club Awards ceremony in December 2018, wowing the audience with their energy and talent.
- Four of the Pebbles ballet students scored above 70% in their first exam in August 2018 and continue to improve thanks to our loyal volunteer ballet teacher Samantha.
- Pebbles hosted a successful inter-farm netball tournament in April 2018, which included a sporty team made up of Pebbles staff members.
- The number of surfers who attended surfing lessons provided by Surf4Life increased from 14 to 24 in 2018, with these learners gaining confidence in the water and developing some impressive surfing skills.



Special Educational Needs (SEN) Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Our Special Needs Programme supports children with special educational needs between the ages of 3 months to 18 years. Early screening and the identification of developmental delays as well as barriers to learning are essential in providing timeous intervention and support. The SEN programme has been funded by Marks and Spencer PLC for the last 8 years.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- A monitoring tool was created by our ECD SEN Programme Manager, Liezl, in partnership with the Occupational Therapy faculty of Stellenbosch University to measure the development of children in the ECD programme and to identify children with learning disabilities and to track their progress.
- Dance and Movement therapy students from the Netherlands supported the children in the Pebbles ECD SEN programme through a range of interactive activities.
- The ASC SEN Programme Manager Helena supported 138 learners, identified barriers to learning and organised the additional support that each learner required.
- 13 learners had the opportunity to participate in a practical skills activity each term and produced some lovely products that were displayed and sold at our end of year awards ceremony.

Hemel-En-Aarde Education Project (HEAEP)

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The HEAEP began in early 2017 to offer educational services to the farming communities in the Hemel-en-Aarde valley in Hermanus. This project was made possible thanks to generous funding received from the Cape Wine Auction Trust and the tireless dedication and hard work of the Project Manager, Madelein, and the support of her team of educators: Maretha, Janmarie, Nashley, Marcelle, Christina and Nicole.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 A grant of \$65,380 was approved by Rotary International as a global grant for the renovation of a derelict farm building, which was transformed into a state-of-the-art ECD centre to offer quality early education to 70 learners from the surrounding farms. Special thanks to Ian Wallace and Rotary Hermanus for instigating and driving this project.
- 👉 Freudenberg Help e.V. provided the funds to purchase a prefabricated FTD classroom for children aged 6 – 18 months. The new classroom will enable us to accommodate an additional 20 babies and toddlers. Freudenberg Help e.V also funded a brand new double classroom for our After-School Club learners.
- 👉 We are in the process of rezoning a portion of the farm to enable us to register as an Independent Education Site, where we can establish our very first Pebbles Academy to provide full time education for Grade R – 12 learners from the local area.
- 👉 Funding from Grandslots was received for a new 26 seater bus to transport the children from their homes to our facility and we appointed a new driver in July 2018.
- 👉 Local medical and dental professionals assisted us with hearing tests, visual tests and dental extractions; the support we have received from the local Hermanus community has been incredible.
- 👉 A big thank you to Carolyn, Salome and Creation Wines for their tireless dedication to this project.



School Leavers Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Mid-teen years are a tricky period in any child's life. School subject and career choices, application processes and further education opportunities can be overwhelming. We work with our children to help them make informed, self-aware educational and career choices.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 21 Grade 9 learners took part in psychometric testing in 2018 to guide their subject choices for Grade 10.
- 👉 Three learners successfully completed their internships and were permanently employed by the companies where they interned.
- 👉 Six young adults graduated from their courses at Boland College, Bergzicht Training College and Stellempoy. Two of these learners are completing their internship in Pebbles ECD centres and one is now permanently employed in the Pebbles kitchen.
- 👉 Mineke and Bernadette, our School Leaver programme staff, assisted 9 learners to enrol at Boland College (Stellenbosch, Paarl and Worcester sites) and all of them were awarded NSFAS (National Student Financial Aid Scheme) bursaries.



- 👉 14 learners participated in the Dare Devils programme in February 2019, which was presented by Nikki, a long-standing supporter from Holland, who also raised funds in the Netherlands to enable her to bring the programme to Pebbles.
- 👉 A special thank you to KVV who have been funding this programme since 2014 and support our learners by hosting exciting and interactive open days.

Health Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Pebbles provides quality health, wellness and dentistry services to rural farm worker communities in the Western Cape. All of the Pebbles children receive free health and dental care; adults can make use of the service for a nominal fee. Core donors for the Health Programme include EDEKA Südwest, Germany and the Cape Wine Auction Trust.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 A total of 6946 patients were seen by our two Clinical Nursing Practitioners, Samantha and Nina, at our Owethu clinic on Villiera farm. 3762 of these consultations were for children under the age of 18.
- 👉 We appointed a new dental practitioner, Damiana, in January 2019. Damiana continued to implement the successful brushing programme in our ECD and ASC facilities and also provided dental treatment to our beneficiaries, their parents and other employees from local farms and businesses. 210 teeth were extracted and 3 children received orthodontic treatment.
- 👉 Not only did our Pebbles children benefit from the wellness, health and dental services, we also provided support to children from other local children's charities and neighbouring farms. Olivia, our capable and friendly clinic administrator ensured that appointments were booked and that the clinic ran smoothly.
- 👉 The clinic received its own bus and appointed Cornelia as the driver to provide transport for patients.



Nutrition Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Pebbles Nutrition Programme ensures that our beneficiaries receive the essential nutrients they need for optimal learning to take place and to reduce the number of children in our centres who are underweight or at risk of stunting. The programme provides ECD learners a cooked breakfast, lunch and two snacks daily and the ASC learners receive a cooked lunch and snack each day before tackling their homework and recreational activities.

According to 2016 data from the Department of Health, nearly 12% of children in the Western Cape are underweight and 23% have stunted growth.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 Rachel has expertly managed the Nutrition Programme since its inception in 2014, supported by her enthusiastic team members Hendrik and Lance.
- 👉 Our Nutrition Programme team distributed 123,938 meals during 2018 and 438 ECD learners were screened and weighed to track their growth.



Pebbles Kitchen

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The state-of-the-art Pebbles Kitchen opened on the 21st January 2019 - on time and under budget - thanks to Dominic, Darren and their team of kitchen assistants: Jesmin, Kaliena and Nadia. The kitchen was funded by Stichting Clouds Foundation and Goede Mensen Foundation and supported with a donation from KFC Add Hope.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 The kitchen produces 1400 nutritious meals per day, but has the capacity to grow this number to 5000 and to provide meals to organisations all over the Western Cape.
- 👉 All meals are made from scratch, using fresh ingredients. Meals are blast-chilled, packed, frozen, then distributed to our ECD and ASC centres in our refrigerated truck.
- 👉 Local organic vegetable gardeners donate their excess crop to us, and we have created our own successful organic veggie garden in Hemel-en-Aarde, supported by Haygrove Heaven. Our goal is to establish vegetable gardens on the farms where we work to generate additional income for the community members.
- 👉 In the future, we aim to grow the number of NPOs, ECD and ASC centres that we supply with healthy, home-style meals and to partner with more local businesses for donations of food to use in our recipes.

Community Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The programme focuses on engaging communities to participate in the creation of safe, clean and well-functioning environments. This is done through establishing Community Action Committees on farms, where groups of community members seek to find solutions to the challenges that they face in their respective communities. We continued to nurture ongoing partnerships with volunteers and associated organisations as well as offering workshops and training for parents.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 A range of community events were hosted on various farms, including a women's empowerment high tea and a mother-and-son lunch.
- 👉 Five Action Committee members attended a conflict resolution camp and 40 community members attended a leadership training workshop, presented by Leadership for Life.
- 👉 Six Action Committees raised funds to buy Christmas boxes and to pay for year-end parties for the children on their farms.

- 👉 81 Family Strengthening workshops were facilitated by the Community Programme team – Sam, Aimee and Marian, and throughout the year an average of 54 parents and 56 children attended the sessions. Feedback showed that 90% of the participants felt that the workshops had a significantly positive impact on their household.
- 👉 Pebbles was fortunate to host 113 volunteers and interns throughout the 2018 – 2019 year, each of whom gave their time, experience and skills to enhance our work, under the nurturing supervision of Volunteer Programme Manager, Sam.
- 👉 8 interns from Zuyd University in Holland completed a 10-week internship, providing insights from various disciplines such as nursing, occupational therapy, hotel and facility management as well as dance and movement therapy.

Protection Programme

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Pebbles Social Workers, Mineke and Bernadette, support farming communities through difficult times and ensure that children and adults are safe-guarded from harm. Needs that are addressed include neglect, abuse and poor family relationships. Support is provided to promote social change, personal development, family cohesion and community empowerment.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND INTERESTING FACTS

- 👉 Mineke celebrated 10 years of service at Pebbles Project. Congratulations Min!
- 👉 The MOT Life Skills programme was presented on a bi-monthly basis throughout the year and 64 learners were reached.
- 👉 The Sexual Health programme was hosted by the Owethu clinic for girls and boys with their fathers. We are proud to have had a 0% teen pregnancy rate on our Stellenbosch partner farms who participated in this programme.
- 👉 Therapy and intervention support was provided to 59 families, 97 children and 15 adults.
- 👉 During Child Protection month in May, Road Safety and 'Protect My Body' programmes were presented at all ECD and ASC facilities in Stellenbosch.
- 👉 The perseverance of one of our Social Workers and the ASC Special Educational Needs Programme Manager paid off when they secured a place for a precious special needs child in a residential home where he will be cared for, loved and encouraged to reach his full potential.
