After a tough year last year, Pebbles had a much better financial year in 2012 - 2013. Our income increased by R900,000 which enabled us to increase our number of beneficiaries and staff. Our board of trustees have given their time for free to guide the organisation through a period of growth and expansion and we offer gratitude for their passionate contribution. Our board of trustees during 2012 - 2013 were: Anna Lusty, Mzokhona Mvemve, Peter Blaine, Stephen Digby, Keith Prothero, Lucy Warner and Sophia Warner. At the end of the 2012 - 2013 financial year, we sadly accepted the resignation of three trustees - Anna and Mzokhona who have been with Pebbles since its inception in 2004 and Keith who will remain as a Pebbles UK Director and one of our most dedicated fundraisers. As Mzokhona put in his letter of resignation: "Forever a Pebble". These three trustees have given so much to Pebbles over the years and will not be forgotten.






#### Pebbles income 2006 - 2013 SA and UK funds

## Our Programmes. What did we get up to in 2012-2013?



#### FDUCATION PROGRAMME

**Baby Programme:** A student from the Netherlands completed an internship with Pebbles focusing on our baby programme and training a group of teachers on the different areas of development, hygiene in the centres and ergonomics.

**ECD Programme:** Our monthly training workshops have continued to equip the teachers with the ideas, knowledge and skills that they need to run excellent facilities. Additional topics were also covered such as Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders, classroom layout and work ethic. In 2012 the Pebbles ECD Programme was approved by the Department of Social Develoment for registration. Testing of Grade R learners was carried out at local primary schools in order to determine how well the children from Pebbles ECD Centres were performing once they started attending school. The results showed that the Pebbles children performed better in all developmental areas compared to other groups, which proves the effectiveness of our programme.

**ASC Programme:** The ASC programme has developed and improved this year. We have replaced a number of activities with our Critical Skills Development Programme, which assists our Grade R - Grade 12 learners with the basic concepts and skills that they need in order to learn, grow and succeed.



#### HEALTH PROGRAMME

Pebbles has continued to be very involved with the FASD (Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders) Task Team this year. The team comprises of NPOs, Government representatives, medical professionals, researchers and FASD parents and authors. The team dedicates it's time to developing FASD awareness materials and implementing prevention activities. In 2013, the FASD Task Team was responsible for organising an extremely successful conference to mark International FASD Day on the 9th September.




#### **ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME**

During 2012 - 2013, Pebbles was involved in the renovation and upgrading of a number of our facilities. This included some wonderful Mandela Day volunteers who painted, sanded, varnished and cleaned for many more than their 67 minutes-worth. Due to contributions from a farm community fund, the farm owner, a local corporate and a UK school (Darton House) we were able to provide one farm with a brand new ASC building and toilet block. Another UK school (St.Joseph's) spent a week renovating another ECD and ASC building. They raised the funds to pay for all of the equipment and also made a further contribution towards future activities. We are committed to providing safe, secure, clean and stimulating environments for our children.



#### **NUTRITION PROGRAMME**

Our nutrition programme is still in its infancy. Our goal is to have every single child in our care receiving balanced, nutritious meals each day. Following advice from Pebbles, one of the farms has implemented a comprehensive weekly menu to ensure the children are properly fed and able to function at their best.



#### PROTECTION PROGRAMME

**Individual & Family intervention:** Support was given to 46 individuals (including 17 families) focusing on substance abuse, parenting skills and family relationships. One adult and two children were referred to rehabilitation centres to address their substance abuse issues.

**Group intervention:** Our Pebbles social worker managed 2 groups consisting of children/teenagers focusing on behavior modification and prevention of substance abuse (14 children).

Other problems/needs that were addressed by our social worker include: Sexual abuse, coping with the loss of a parent and managing behavior problems displayed by children.

We celebrated two years of sobriety with John and Annalize who are role-models for so many on their farm. Congratulations to two very special people.
